Welcome to the second newsletter for 2017.

Aims: Provide leadership and promote education and research in interventional nephrology through our objectives, which include: development of and coordinating training programmes, on-going education, developing clinical outcome monitoring programmes and accreditation standards. We will promote Nephrology and Interventional nephrology in particular as a career choice.

10th ANZSIN annual meeting (Darwin, NT. 6-8 September 2017)

On behalf of the organising executive committee I encourage you to attend our interventional nephrology meeting – Wednesday afternoon 6 to Friday 8 September 2017. As with previous years, our meeting follows our parent society (ANZSN) annual scientific meeting.

Our interventional nephrology and international guest speaker is Dr Dirk Hentschel from Brigham and Women's Hospital and Assistant Professor of Medicine Harvard Medical School, Boston, USA. Dr Hentschel is widely experienced in vascular access intervention techniques. At this year's meeting Dr Hentschel will be taking us through his expertise and knowledge into AVF management and prolonged survival. His topics of expertise include: Perspectives on Long-term Fistula Health – evaluating AVF by physical examination and translation of angiographic findings and physiological measurements into long-term care plan. Those of us involved in haemodialysis vascular access know only too well the importance of maintenance of a healthy vascular access.

As in previous years we will be utilising local experts within their field – including surgeons and radiologists. Topics to be covered in our **Thursday didactic sessions** include:

- 1. fistula mapping for assessment prior to creation;
- 2. fistula surveillance for maximising survival and early detection of potential problems from both medical and nursing perspectives.
- 3. PD access and related issues, including further progress on our ANZ success with acute early start PD avoiding acute 'crash start' HD.

During the **Friday workshop**, we will hold our hands-on activities, including:

- 1. USS scanning of HD vascular access;
- 2. percutaneous native and transplant renal biopsy techniques;
- 3. PD catheter insertion by Y-Tec and Seldinger techniques;
- 4. fistuloplasty;
- 5. temporary (uncuffed) and long-term (tunneled/cuffed) HD catheters in both IJ and femoral vein sites.

Each registrant will have the opportunity to practice each technique.





The 2017 ANZSIN conference will be held at Oaks Elan, Wood Street, Darwin. Oaks Elan is located approximately 15 minutes from Darwin Airport; centrally located and within walking distance to the Darwin Convention Centre, the Esplanade, Bicentennial Park and various dining, shopping and entertainment options.
